#### Introduction:

Effective Fall semester 2021, the Department of Special & Early Childhood Education, College of Education & Human Services at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh recognizes an educational partnership with the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) with regard to graduates of the Associate of Applied Science Degree Program in Foundations of Teacher Education. This agreement will provide a bachelor's degree completion program articulating transfer to the Bachelor of Science in Education degree program in Cross-categorical Special Education licensure.

The goal of this agreement is to refine the existing system or transfer for special education professionals completing an associate degree within the Wisconsin Technical College System as they transition into the Special Education teacher licensure program at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. The agreement coordinates the competency-based assessment system and develops consistency between institutions for students. Fox Valley Technical College (FVTC) and Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) have served as our partners in this initiative; however, this program will apply to all institutions in the Wisconsin Technical College System offering the Foundations of Teacher Education program.

### **University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Admission Requirements:**

Wisconsin Technical College students must also meet University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Admission Requirements. UW Oshkosh reviews official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended. UW Oshkosh can accept transfer credits from accredited institutions only. If a student has transferred credits from a non-accredited institution to a WTCS program, those credits will not be accepted at UW Oshkosh and will need to be completed.

#### Conditions:

The terms of transfer of this program-to-program articulation agreement apply *only* for the purposes of entry to the Bachelor of Science in Education degree program in Special Education (licensure crosscategorical grades 4k-12) at UW Oshkosh. Students from the Wisconsin technical College System seeking admission to other degree programs offered at UW Oshkosh may transfer to the University only those credits recognized under the current UW System – WTCS Transfer Guidelines as documented in Transferology. Wisconsin Technical College System students admitted to UW Oshkosh under the terms of the articulation agreement who subsequently elect to pursue a degree and major other than the Bachelor of Science in Education degree program in Special Education (licensure cross-categorical grades 4k-12) will find the extended transfer of credit *does not apply* outside of that program.

Students from the WTCS must have *completed* the above-named Associate of Applied Science degree program (fulfilling all course work stipulated in the appropriate appended credit transfer grid) with a graduating grade point average of 2.75 or higher for consideration for transfer under the terms of this articulation document. The terms of the articulation agreement do *not* apply to WTCS students who have completed only a portion of the required courses for the Associate of Applied Science degree program named above.

#### **Transfer of Credits:**

The Bachelor of Science in Education Degree program in Special Education (licensure cross-categorical grades 4k-12) at UW Oshkosh accepts in transfer the general education, pre-professional education, and education courses stipulated within the appended credit transfer grid for the Associate of Applied Science Degree Program in Foundations of Teacher Education.

While Foundations of Teacher Education core courses are consistent across WTCS institutions, it is recognized that general education requirements may vary. General education credits from campuses other than WTCS campuses will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. However, the courses listed here may serve as a guide for other institutions.

This agreement abides by UW System policy to transfer a maximum of 72 credits earned at two-year institutions to the University of Wisconsin Baccalaureate degree programs.

Our UW Oshkosh transcripts will indicate 137-147 credits to degree.

If any of the Remaining General Education/Degree Requirements are completed as part of the associate degree, those also could transfer and reduce the total credits to degree required.

Candidates would be required to pass the Foundations of Reading Test (FoRT) since they would not take Lit 305 at UW Oshkosh. If unable to pass the FoRT, these students could also return to UW Oshkosh after graduation and successfully complete a summer graduate class that is approved to replace the FoRT.

The transfer agreement will be reviewed and updated as needed, when changes are made in the programs of either institution.
