## **ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**

### **For transfer of credits between The University of Wisconsin-Superior Bachelor of Science in Public Health and the Wisconsin Technical College System Nursing Program Associate of Applied Science Degree**

Effective Dates: June 2021-2026

Review Date: December 2025

#### **Introduction and Rationale:**

The University of Wisconsin-Superior maintains an educational partnership with Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) to provide opportunities for students to enter bachelor's degree completion programs. In the interest of fostering cooperation between our institutions, and to better serve the transfer of students from WTCS to the University of Wisconsin-Superior, the faculty and administration of our institutions have established this articulation agreement.

This agreement specifies the transfer of credit from the WTCS Nursing AAS degree named above to the UW-S Bachelor's Degree named above in recognition that the Nursing AAS program prepares students for the admission to this Bachelor's degree program. The underlying assumption for this agreement is that WTCS provides a foundation of coursework and the University provides the upper-level course required within the Bachelor's degree program.

WTCS students who successfully complete the Nursing Associate degree named above and wishing to transfer to the University of Wisconsin-Superior will be awarded the following credits toward a Bachelor of Science Public Health Degree.

### Requirements and Considerations:

Students from WTCS must have completed the above-named program with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.3 on a 4.0 scale for consideration for transfer under the terms of this document.

WTCS general education /breadth courses in communication, social sciences, mathematics and natural science may transfer in to fulfill UW-Superior university studies requirement in these areas. All UW-Superior university studies core and knowledge category requirements not met by transfer credits must be completed.

A minimum of 33 credits from the program named above may be transferred in as listed above and counted towards the Public Health degree.

Other credits from WTCS may transfer in as credits toward graduation, but do not fit in a particular category in relation to the Public Health degree.

Elective courses taken at WTCS which are not listed in the agreement will be reviewed by the faculty of the UW-Superior degree program named above on a case by case basis.

Fifty two (52) total credits are required to complete the bachelor's degree named above.

A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at UW-Superior in order to be awarded any degree from UW-Superior. The last 12 credits must be taken at UW-Superior.

Students must maintain a 2.3/4.0 grade point average in upper division courses to be eligible for the bachelor's degree named above.

Students are required to complete a final internship and senior research project to fulfill graduation requirement for the bachelor's degree named above

## **Advising**

The UW-Superior and the WTCS colleges will provide academic advising to WTCS college learners inquiring about UW-Superior's programs. Learners will be connected with a UW-Superior advisor prior to transfer. UW-Superior and WTCS colleges will share materials, catalogs, and other information to facilitate the understanding of requirements and programs. WTCS colleges will assist UW-Superior in arranging recruitment events on its campuses.

## **Marketing**

Any marketing of this agreement will be subject to the prior approval of UW-Superior and the WTCS colleges and will adhere to each institutions standards for the use of its name and logo. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population. Each institution may provide a link to this agreement and/or the other institution(s) on its website, with notice to the other party.

## **Conditions:**

The terms of this articulation agreement apply only for the purposes of entry to the Bachelor of Science Degree at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. WTCS students seeking admission to other degree programs offered at UW-Superior may transfer to the University only those credits recognized under the current transfer guidelines as documented on the TES/Transferology web site at [tes.collegesource.com](http://tes.collegesource.com).

This agreement is limited to University requirements for completion of a Bachelor's degree only. Students seeking certification for licensure in particular fields must complete any additional requirements for such certification.

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


