The Program

The Edwin E. and Janet L. Bryant Foundation, Inc. has established a scholarship program to assist former students of Stoughton High School and the high schools of all the Wisconsin communities where Nelson Industries, Inc. had manufacturing plant locations. Renewable scholarships are offered for full or part-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice. The program is aimed toward helping the non-traditional student.

Eligibility

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be high school graduates or be current postsecondary undergraduates. Candidates must have at least a high school diploma or GED certificate.
- Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in part-time or full-time undergraduate student at an accredited two-year or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school for the entire spring term.
- Attended or graduated from high school in one of the following Wisconsin communities:
 - Stoughton
 - Neillsville
 - Black River Falls
 - Mineral Point
 - Viroqua
 - Bloomer
 - Wautoma
 - Arcadia
 - Muscoda
 - Montello

Awards

Recipients attending a two-year college or vocational/technical school will receive up to \$2,000 annually for part-time enrollment or up to \$4,000 annually for full-time enrollment.

Recipients attending a four-year college or university will receive up to \$6,000 annually for part-time enrollment or up to \$12,000 annually for full-time enrollment.

Awards may be renewed for up to five additional years or until a bachelor's degree is earned, whichever occurs first. Renewal is contingent upon satisfactory academic performance in a full-time course of study and continuation of the program by The Edwin E. and Janet L. Bryant Foundation, Inc.

Awards are for undergraduate study only.

Scholarship Timeline

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must meet the requirements below. Please read the requirements carefully to ensure you meet eligibility before applying.

- Must be a graduating high school senior in your final semester who has been accepted to university or must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at a 4-year, 2-year, vocational, or technical institution in the United States.

- Must be a US citizen or permanent legal resident.

- Must be a single father, child of a single father, or closely impacted by a single father.

- All fields of study and GPAs will be considered.

How to Apply

We know that single dads have a lot on their plate -- from raising a family to pursuing education and a career, all while defying expectations and forging their own path.

In your application for the **Little Bundle Superdad Scholarship**, we want to know how you do it. We want to hear about the challenges you've faced while juggling fatherhood and education, how you make ends meet, and what motivates you to keep going and keep dreaming. We'd love to hear about your relationship with your children and why you think that education is important -- not only to your life, but to their future, as well. Tell us what makes life as a single dad rewarding, and what special moments have stuck with you during your parenting journey.

High school seniors and current technical college students that are in their first year of a two-year program are encouraged to apply.

Application deadline is January 15, 2021. Only students with complete application files by the deadline will be invited for a personal interview at a hosting dealership in their area. The interview is for the scholarship only, not employment.

IMPORTANT: ONLY Online applications will be accepted.

Evaluation Forms: The instructor/employer technical skill evaluation and the personal evaluation forms are confidential online forms. Just click on the appropriate form on our website.

No FAFSA or income information is required to apply for this scholarship.

Tuition amounts vary and can be up to full tuition. Average tuition awards are \$3,000 (\$750 per semester for four semesters). Snap-on Tool sets may be awarded independently or in conjunction with tuition awards and have a retail value of \$4,270. Students that are not already working in the automotive industry can receive employment assistance. The goal is to have all students working part-time while attending school to get on-the-job training and mentoring to enhance their education experience and graduate with a full-time job!

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the RMEL Foundation is to award scholarships to deserving and qualified students in engineering, business, information systems, plant, line or distribution technology, line worker or other curriculum related to the electric energy industry.

AWARDS

Awards will be made in two categories:

1. **RMEL Foundation Scholarships.** These scholarships are awarded in amounts ranging from \$1,000-\$3,000. See the eligibility requirements below for these scholarships.
2. **RMEL Foundation Named Scholarships.** These scholarships are provided by the Foundation in the name of the individual or corporate donor.

ELIGIBILITY

The applicant must be a current high school senior, high school graduate or current university/college undergraduate (freshman, sophomore, junior or senior) student. In addition, you must fulfill ONE of the following:

1. Be pursuing or plan to pursue an electric industry position certificate (lineman program, renewable energy certificate, etc.) and be able to provide information about the specific program you are or will attend and the accreditation status of the institution.
2. Be pursuing or plan to pursue an undergraduate degree with intent to pursue a career in the electric energy industry.

And, the applicant must:

1. Be a permanent U.S. resident.
2. Complete the online application in its entirety.

Note: If awarded a scholarship the recipient will be asked throughout the remaining years of college to periodically provide RMEL with information including expected graduation date, expected degree, internships, and post-graduate employment.

HOW RECIPIENTS ARE CHOSEN

A Selection Committee of the RMEL Foundation reviews all applications and selects the recipients. The selection criteria are:

1. Goals and aspirations in the electric energy industry
2. Motivation to succeed
3. Service to community and school

4. Academic performance

HOW TO APPLY

There are four 2021 RMEL Foundation Scholarship Applications. Please be sure to read the descriptions below to find the correct application for you. [ACCESS THE APPLICATIONS](#), and read below for more information.

Note: *Completing the incorrect application may affect your eligibility to be considered for a 2021 scholarship. If you are unsure which application to complete, please contact James Sakamoto at jamessakamoto@rmel.org or (303) 865-5544 prior to beginning the application process.*

Current High School Senior – if you are currently a high school senior and will be enrolling in a 4-year/baccalaureate degree program for the 2021-2022 academic year, complete this application. Current high school seniors planning to enroll in a certificate program, see “2021 Craft (Lineman/Operations) Program Scholarship” application below.

Current 4-Year/Baccalaureate Degree Student – if you are currently enrolled as a freshman, sophomore or junior at a 4-year college/university, complete this application. If you are a current high school senior or have received an RMEL Foundation Scholarship in the past, do not complete this application.

2021 Craft (Lineman/Operations) Program Scholarship – if you are currently enrolled (or will be enrolling) in a 2-year/certificate program (lineman program, renewable energy certificate, etc.) complete this application.

Previous RMEL Foundation Scholarship Recipient – this application is exclusively for 4-year/baccalaureate AND Craft (Lineman/Operations) Program Scholarship Application students who have previously been awarded an RMEL Foundation Scholarship. If you have not previously received an RMEL Foundation Scholarship, please complete one of the applications listed above.
