- Ability to generate, organize, and implement lesson plans to meet specific needs of students representing diverse backgrounds.
- Incorporate the use of technology into the teaching learning process.
- Pursue, maintain and attend Professional Development opportunities, conferences, annual in-service and workshops, and membership to WDTSEA (Wisconsin Driver Traffic Safety Education Association), to maintain a high level of technical competency.
- Maintain strict confidentiality of student information Family Educational Rights Privacy Act (FERPA).
- Model core abilities as outlined by the College.
- Maintain positive rapport with the public, contracted high schools, community and promote driver safety.
- Other duties as assigned.
